Third Sunday of Advent:

ADVENT: This Sunday, 12th December, is the 3rd Sunday of Advent, also known as Gaudete (Joy) Sunday. It is a time to reflect and prepare for the coming of Christ. The Advent Wreath is a reminder that we are preparing to celebrate the coming of Jesus - The Light of the World in darkest winter. For the 3rd Sunday we light the pink candle on our wreath.

All make the Sign of the Cross +

A member of the family lights the 1st, 2nd and 3rd (pink) candle

Loving God, on this Advent night we turn to you in prayer. As we prepare to celebrate the birth of your Son, we ask your blessing on each of us. Open our hearts to the good news that you bring to us and help us to welcome your light into our lives, a light that gives us the gift of joy in the Lord. May we see that our deepest joy comes from knowing you. May this joy fill our hearts, our minds and our home. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Together we say: Come Lord Jesus.

Gospel Luke 3:10-18

'Someone is coming who will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire'

When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your

rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in



a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.

Advent Reflection

It is important for us to realise that the Gospel is not a burden added to the many we already have. It is a proclamation of happiness. The cheerfulness of the Christian, as we are told in the first two readings, comes from the Lord who is among us and from the fact that evil had been defeated.

Our lives have meaning, even when they seem not to, because God loves us and plans happiness for each one of us, a plan that he will certainly implement. The Gospel shows us how to experience the Joy promised to those who welcome Christ, by sharing our goods, avoiding injustice, and by not oppressing people.

It makes compassion a key factor of the Gospel of Christ. Compassion as we are told is our ability to feel the pains and suffering of others. It means seeing ourselves mirrored in those whose lives are fragile for lack of food, shelter, and medical care. Those who are naked, hungry, thirsty, homeless and sick experience deep joy when someone, out of a sense of compassion, care for them. Each day there are people near and far who wait for assistance so as to be able to live bette lives.

When compassion is shown in real ways, joy is rediscovered and celebrated. Selfishness, on the contrary, breeds sadness. Those who are selfish may have everything this world offers, yet deep down they lack the joy of giving and sharing and are thus unhappy with their life.
