**Gospel: John 1:35-42** 

They saw where he lived, and stayed with him.

As John stood with two of his disciples, Jesus passed, and John stared hard at him and said, 'Look, there is the lamb of God.' Hearing this, the two disciples followed Jesus. Jesus turned round, saw them following and said, 'What do you want?' They answered, 'Rabbi,' — which means Teacher — 'where do you live?' 'Come and see' he replied; so they went and saw where he lived, and stayed with him the rest of that day. It was about the tenth hour.

One of these two who became followers of Jesus after hearing what John had said was Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter. Early next morning, Andrew met his brother and said to him, 'We have found the Messiah' – which means the Christ – and he took Simon to Jesus. Jesus looked hard at him and said, 'You are Simon son of John; you are to be called Cephas' – meaning Rock.

**YEAR OF SAINT JOSEPH** was announced by Pope Francis on 8<sup>th</sup> December last, with the Apostolic Letter 'Patris Corde' ('With a Father's Heart'). Pope Francis recalls the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the declaration of St Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To mark the occasion the year from 8<sup>th</sup> December 2020 to 8<sup>th</sup> December 2021 has been proclaimed by Pope Francis as a 'Year of Saint Joseph.' We ask St Joseph to intercede for us.
